#### FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK

**The Start of In-person Learning -** It has been great seeing our students back at Deephaven this week. We are treating the full return of our students like the start of a school year and using our approach of going slow to go fast. We take time to model and practice our routines to set students up for success. We are able to maximize our instructional time when students know the expectations. Our staff has done a terrific job through all of the transitions this year and your support for them is greatly appreciated. I have heard many stories from staff about how supportive our parent community has been this year. We appreciate your

support and partnership. Together, we have been able to provide students the best education possible, with the restrictions that have been placed upon us. I am hopeful that we can keep this model in place through June, as being in school is the best place for our students!

**Student Drop Off and Pick Up** – Beat the traffic and the buses by dropping your child off before 7:40 a.m. Students are allowed to go directly to their classrooms and prepare for their school day. After school, we need your help arriving at your designated time to help move our car line along quicker. Please see the arrival times below.

## **Arrival Times:**

- 2:35 Parents with a child in kindergarten or first grade and those with siblings in 2<sup>nd</sup> – 5<sup>th</sup> grade..
- **2:38** Parents with a child in grade 2 or 3.
- **2:40** Parents with a child in grades 4 or 5.

Arriving before your designated time slows our line down since we are dismissing grade levels at different times.

Stopping on the bridge or on Minnetonka Blvd. is NOT ALLOWED. Cars lining up on Vine Hill, north of the school's exit need to loop around and come back to the line. The Deephaven Police will be ticketing individuals stopped on the bridge and on Minnetonka Blvd. We can avoid this problem by having everyone arrive at their scheduled time listed above.

## **Procedures for Dropping Off Items for Students at Deephaven:**

• Please call our main number at 952-401-6900 to let the front office staff know that you are dropping off an item for your child.

- There is a small table in the vestibule area where you can fill out a pink slip to leave with the item. Staff will get the item to your child.
- Please do not enter the office area.

## Dropping Off a Student at Deephaven:

- Please call our main number at 952-401-6900 to let the front office know that you are dropping off your child outside of normal school hours.
- You may then walk your child into the vestibule, and we will meet you at the office door. Please remain outside of the office and we will bring your child in to take their temperature.
- If their temperature is normal, we will give you a wave to let you know it is safe to leave, and your child will move on to their classroom.

# Administration and Administration Support Roles: Behavior Management

We are organized in a way that has certain people supporting students in the following ways:

Bryan McGinley – School Principal. Overall supervision of staff and school operations and involved when school suspensions take place.

Anelise Peterson – Administrative Support. Mrs. Peterson works with staff and students in a supportive role. She typically addresses more serious behaviors. She is also an excellent contact person if your child is struggling in school.

Theresa Brown – Behavior Manager. Mrs. Brown works with students to resolve conflicts. She also gives students consequences for misbehaving. She is an great resource for parents with a child struggling with their behavior.

Howe Siegel – School Counselor. Mr. Siegel works with students on social and emotional skills. He is great resource for parents with a child that is experiencing loss, grief, separation anxiety and more.

Jessica Thull – Social Worker. Ms. Thull works with students on IEP's. She is part of our special education team and supports parents with ideas on how to support their child at home.

Classroom Teacher: As always, your child's classroom teacher is the best person to contact if your child is having difficulties at school. They know your child best and can be an excellent partner when your child is experiencing challenges at school.

Our staff understands all students are unique and different. We are here to work with families and support your child. Please do not hesitate to contact our staff if you have concerns about your child and his/her education at Deephaven.

**Deephaven Paras** – Several paras were hired in the fall to support our Hybrid model and then our Childcare model. Students developed relationships with them and will now see the paras in new roles at our school. We have retained all paras hired last fall, with four reassigned to Minnetonka High School. Below is a list of their most prominent assignment. However, many of the paras have multiple roles at our school, depending on the time of the day. They help with the morning and afternoon drop-off and pick-up process, temperature taking and more. We are grateful for the important work they do to support our students and teachers!

**Mental Health Town Hall Tonight** – Tonight, our district will host a Mental Health Town Hall for an all school community viewing of Angst,

Angst is a 56-minute film and virtual reality experience that explores anxiety, its causes, effects and what we can do about it. The <u>filmmakers'</u> goal is to have a global conversation and raise awareness around anxiety. Angst features candid interviews with kids and young adults who suffer, or have suffered, from anxiety and what they've learned about it. The film includes discussions with mental health experts about the causes of anxiety and its sociological effects, as well as <u>help, resources and</u> <u>tools</u>.
