Personalizing Learning for Every Student

By providing additional access to teachers and support programs, students gain confidence and a stronger academic foundation for future learning

In Minnetonka Public Schools, we believe every child is as unique as every parent's hopes and dreams for that child. We offer personalized instruction, a variety of opportunities and support programs that address each student's just-right learning level.

ELEMENTARY SCHOOLS

Our elementary schools are filled with lively students who bring a myriad of strengths to the classroom. Teachers inspire students to excel as they move through the curriculum. By carefully monitoring progress, teachers can provide extra assistance in reading or more challenging assignments in math, for example. Minnetonka's multi-tiered system of support can include long-term, short-term or even project-based strategies depending on the student's level of need. Our goal is to engage every student and build a strong foundation for future learning.

In Deephaven's after-school BLAST program, teachers, parents, and high school volunteers assist students with homework, goal setting and organization skills (see the BLAST video at https://vimeo.com/188718282).

Last spring at Minnewashta, a small group of students practiced geometry concepts by measuring, planning and creating paper prototypes for the school's GroVert[™] plant gallery.

THROUGH MIDDLE SCHOOL

Differentiated learning is a highlight of middle school as students explore

interests and expand their abilities by choosing courses with varying levels of rigor. Many courses are personalized to give students a "voice and choice" in how then demonstrate their learning. For example, a student may research a topic of interest in history and then create a multimedia project to show what they know.

Personalized learning changes the support students need from teachers and staff. When doors open at MME and MMW before and after school, students are just as likely to consult with teachers on a project plan as they are to work with dedicated math specialists on an algebra concept.

Each student has a school counselor who monitors academic and social/emotional growth. They connect students with convenient support resources to help them stay on track, gain confidence and excel.

AT MINNETONKA HIGH SCHOOL

Academic choice and rigor is a hallmark of our high school, giving students flexibility in what they learn and how they set a course for the future. To help students achieve their highest aspirations, staff at MHS are focused on building exceptional relationships and delivering exceptional learning experiences. Academic support is an important part of building this culture.

Before 7:00 a.m., students pour into the high school to meet with teachers or work with other students on group projects. One day a week, every student follows a modified schedule that provides additional access to teachers during the first 40 minutes of the day.

Peer tutoring is also available through the Writing Center (now in its tenth academic year), Math Center and Academic Anchors tutoring. These programs match students with specially trained peers to provide guidance and support in any academic area.

Every day, district students benefit from making personal connections with caring individuals at school. It's that care and attention to personalized learning that makes a difference and helps our students succeed.

Message from the Superintendent


Enrollment planning in Minnetonka is a year around process, as we have used enrollment over the past ten years to assure stability in funding during some of the most challenging years in recent history. The use of Open Enrollment under Minnesota statutes has brought in over \$100,000,000 to support all students in the District. We have used about \$35,000,000 of that for the new students, but the rest of it has gone to support the high quality opportunities afforded to Minnetonka students and to keep all of our schools open.

In fact, enrollment today is more than 4,300 students above what was projected for 2016 just ten years ago. Furthermore, this year's Kindergarten class is the largest class of any grade in Minnetonka's history at 874. Families clamor to get their five-year-olds in the next class each year at this time. In each of the last two years, we have had about 1,000 applications for approximately 870 positions.

It is a wonderful experience to anticipate the excitement in each family as they seek to have their Kindergartener become a Skipper and for us to build a relationship that will last for thirteen years. Some families apply when the child is a baby to assure a place five years hence, and others move into the District to assure a place. As noted in this card, it is time to finalize enrollment for 2017!
